CATECHISM

The Seventh Commandment Thou shalt not steal.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not rob our neighbor of his money or property, nor bring them into our possession by unfair dealing or fraud, but help him to improve and protect his property and living. Lot choose which land he wanted. Abram knew God would always provide no matter where he lived. Lot looked at the land and chose the Jordan Valley because it was better. Abram settled in Canaan.

One day, an enemy army attacked the city of Sodom where Lot lived. The army captured Lot and his neighbors. The army stole their valuable belongings. When Abram heard this, he wanted to help. He took 318 men and went to rescue Lot and the other people. God helped them win the battle. All the people were set free!

The king of Sodom thanked Abram and wanted to give him a reward. The king wanted to give all his property to Abram. But Abram had promised God he would not take anything, not even a thread or a sandal strap. Abram trusted God to take care of him, so he told the king, "You keep your money and property."

Abram did not rescue Lot to get a reward. Abram helped Lot because he loved Lot and wanted what was best for him. Abram helped Lot and his neighbors keep what belonged to them.

God wants us to show love for our friends and neighbors by helping them. God promises to take care of us just like He did Abram.
