#### Materials needed for this lesson:

#### Lesson Preparation

As you prepare for this lesson on "Ruth: A Story of Redemption", read:

#### Ruth 1-4

#### Bible Background

The book of Ruth explains the ancestry of David and builds a bridge between the time of the judges and the time of the kings. This book reveals the providence of God in the way He guided Ruth and Naomi during a difficult time, turning their defeat into victory.

The story takes place during the time of the judges when Israel was at one of its lowest points in history. It was a time of cruelty, apostasy, civil war, and national disgrace because "there was no king in Israel; everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (Judges 21:25). Yet in the midst of this turmoil is a love story that assures us of God's love for the lost.

Ruth's statement in 1:16-17 is a great confession of faith and commitment. Ruth confessed her love for Naomi and her desire to stay with her mother-in-law even unto death. She confessed her faith in the true and living God and promises to worship Him alone. She was willing to forsake her father and mother (Ruth 2:11) in order to cleave to Naomi and be a part of her family in Bethlehem.

The grace of God is seen in Boaz: he invites Ruth into his field to glean (Ruth 2:8-9), he extends to her God's blessing, "under whose wings you have come to seek refuge" (Ruth 2:10-13), and he offers bread that she and Naomi might eat and be satisfied (Ruth 2:14, 18).

The great theme of the book of Ruth is redemption. The word *redeem* means "to set free by paying a price." Boaz, her kinsman through Naomi (Ruth 3:2), paid the price to redeem the land that belonged to Elimelech (Ruth 4:3-9). Then he took Ruth as his wife so that she might become "like Rachel and Leah, both of whom built the house of Israel" (Ruth 4:10-11). Ruth did help "build that house" as the mother of Obed, who was the father of Jesse, who was the father of David (Ruth 4:17).

Ruth, being a Moabitess, was condemned to be forever outside the family of God (Deuteronomy 23:3). However, by God's grace, she became part of the family of Jesus (Matthew 1:5), "who will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord will give Him the throne of His father David;...and His kingdom will have no end" (Luke 1:32-33). So all who are excluded from the "commonwealth of Israel, and to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world...have been brought near by the blood of Christ" (Ephesians 2:12-13). And through Jesus, the Son of David, they "are fellow-citizens with the saints, and are of God's household..." (Ephesians 2:19).

#### Vocabulary

Misfortune—events that result in unfavorable change
Threshing—separating harvested grain from the stalk by striking
Kinsman-Redeemer—a man who delivers a relative by paying a price or a ransom
Transact—to carry on something
Heathen—used to describe those who do not following the God of the Bible
Sickle—a short-handled tool with a curved blade
Sheaves—a bundle of grain stalks with the heads still containing their seeds
Gleaning—a Hebrew custom allowing the poor to gather left-over grain
Winnowing—tossing grain into the wind in order to separate the usefull seed from the useless plant material

#### Lesson Objectives

Keeping the following objectives in mind, work through student Lesson 22-"Ruth: A Story of Redemption"

(Reduced student pages are located on the next 3 pages).

1. Students will learn the story of Ruth.

2. Students will learn about the ways God provided for Ruth and Naomi.

3. Students will learn how God was in control of the events in the lives of Ruth and Naomi.

4. Students will learn that we have a Redeemer in Jesus.

#### <u>Class Time</u>

Then write: Deborah, Gideon, and Samson


Have students share one event in the life of each one of the Judges listed above that is an example of how "One plus God is always a majority."

the "Period of the Judges" on the **TIMELINE**. Then have them locate Ruth on the **TIMELINE**.




#### Teach the Lesson

#### Catechism Corner

Read through the Catechism Corner. Challenge students to memorize the Catechism question and answer found in #1.

This CATECHISM CORNER further develops the concept of *redeemer* and focuses on Christ as our *redeemer*.

Student will also discuss how Boaz's actions as a kinsmanredeemer give us a picture of Christ as our perfect redeemer.

#### Questions

- 1. a. God provided for Naomi by giving her Ruth to accompany her back to Israel.
  - b. Ruth went out to glean grain so they would have something to eat and found she was gleaning in a field of Boaz, a relative of Naomi's.
  - c. Boaz was very kind to Ruth, took notice of her, and helped protect her.
  - d. Boaz bought Naomi's property and married Ruth. He became their kinsman-redeemer.
  - e. Boaz and Ruth had a son (Obed).
  - f. Ruth became the great-grandmother of King David and is listed in the genealogy of Jesus.

#### **Catechism Corner**




